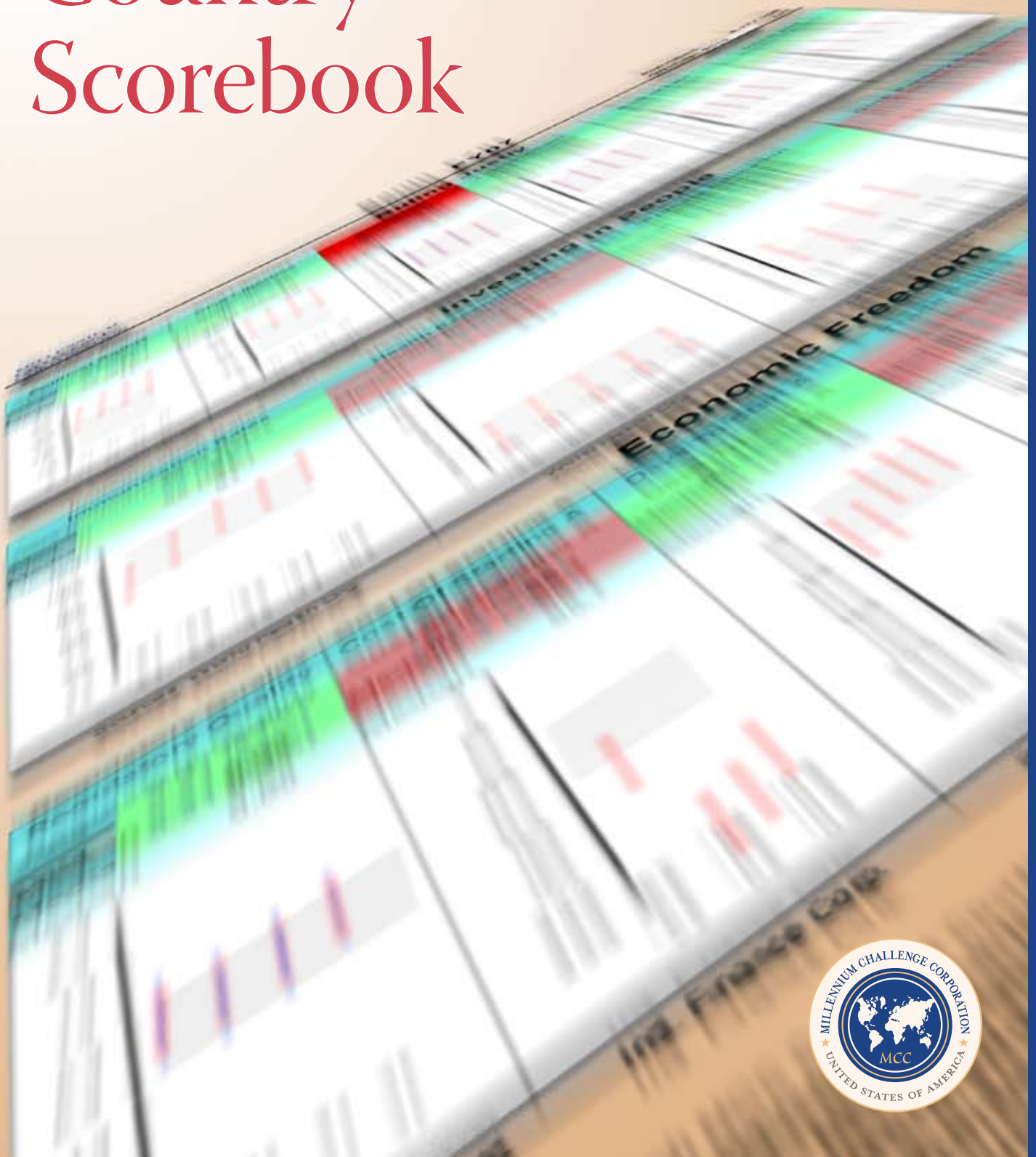

## Introduction To The Millennium Challenge Account

Created by Congress and the President in 2004, the Millennium Challenge Account (MCA) is an innovative foreign assistance program designed to reduce poverty through sustainable economic growth in the world's poorest countries. Its creation grew out of a commitment made in 2002 by President George W. Bush at the Monterrey conference on development in poor countries.

As an independent U.S. Government corporation, the Millennium Challenge Corporation (MCC) administers MCA funds provided annually by Congress and is managed by a Chief Executive Officer (CEO) and a public-private

### Eligible & Threshold Countries

Currently, twenty five countries are eligible for MCA Compact assistance: Armenia; Benin; Burkina Faso; Bolivia; Cape Verde; East Timor; El Salvador; Georgia; Ghana; Honduras; Jordan; Lesotho; Madagascar; Mali; Moldova; Mongolia; Morocco; Mozambique; Namibia; Nicaragua; Senegal; Sri Lanka; Tanzania; Ukraine; and Vanuatu.

Among these eligible countries, MCC has approved 11 Compacts worth \$3 billion with Armenia, Benin, Cape Verde, El Salvador, Georgia, Ghana, Honduras, Madagascar, Mali, Nicaragua, and Vanuatu. MCC is actively working toward finalizing Compacts with the remaining countries.

To provide a further incentive for policy reform, Congress also established the Threshold Program for countries that demonstrate a significant commitment to meeting the eligibility criteria but fall short in only a few policy areas. Threshold assistance helps countries address specific areas of policy weakness identified in the MCA selection

indicators. Twenty countries are currently eligible for Threshold Program assistance: Albania; Burkina Faso; East Timor; Guyana; Indonesia; Kenya; Kyrgyz Republic; Jordan; Malawi; Moldova; Niger; Paraguay; Peru; Philippines; Rwanda; São Tomé and Príncipe; Tanzania; Uganda; Ukraine; and Zambia.

To date, MCC has approved 11 Threshold agreements totaling more than \$300 million with Albania, Burkina Faso, Indonesia, Jordan, Malawi, Moldova, Paraguay, Philippines, Tanzania, Ukraine, and Zambia. Additional Threshold agreements are pending and are expected to be reviewed by the Board in 2007.

Two countries, The Gambia and Yemen, which were previously eligible for Compact and Threshold assistance respectively, have been suspended from participation with MCC. In both cases, the suspensions were due to serious deterioration in indicator scores and an absence of initiative on the part of the governments in either country to remedy the issues.

Board of Directors comprised of five public sector members—the Secretary of State, Secretary of the Treasury, U.S. Trade Representative, the Administrator of the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID), the CEO of the MCC—and up to four private sector members who are appointed by the President and confirmed by the United States Senate. MCC draws its diverse staff from various U.S. Government agencies, the private sector, universities, international development agencies, and non-government organizations.

Each November, the MCC Board of Directors meets to select countries eligible to develop a proposal for MCA assistance. This Scorebook, produced by MCC in advance of the selection of newly eligible countries, includes information about how the poorest countries of the world have performed on 16 independent and transparent policy benchmarks, known as indicators. These indicators measure countries' demonstrated commitment to policies that promote political and economic freedom, investments in education and health care, control of corruption, and respect for civil liberties and the rule of law.

Recognizing that development is achieved by a country's own efforts, policies, and people, MCA assistance offers selected countries an opportunity to identify their own priorities for achieving sustainable economic growth and poverty reduction. Once selected as eligible, a country undertakes the process of developing an MCA proposal for funding in broad consultation with its own citizens. MCC teams then work in partnership to help countries

### **What investments are being made?**

Once selected as eligible, countries partnered with MCC begin a consultation process with their own citizens and the private sector to discuss the barriers to poverty reduction and economic growth. Many countries have identified improvements of roads, ports, and railroads as key to improving access to markets, schools, and health clinics for their people. Land tenure and agriculture projects, micro-lending credit programs, and improvements to irrigation systems are priorities for many countries that have targeted their efforts to reduce rural poverty. Other countries are proposing the building of industrial parks, a trade school, health clinics, and improvements to water and sanitation services.

refine their Compact proposals to ensure they will reduce poverty through sustainable economic growth. A Compact also describes how the country plans to manage and implement its MCA program, including how it will ensure financial accountability, transparency, fair and open procurement, and how it will measure results.

### **About This Scorebook**

The 2007 Country Performance Scorebook is the fourth publication of country performance data since the establishment of MCC. The Scorebook draws on data from numerous sources to inform the American people, the Board of Directors, MCC staff, Congress, and the Administration of the progress that candidate countries are making in adopting policies designed to encourage poverty reduction through economic growth.

This year's Scorebook includes data on 98 countries. The list includes both candidate countries and every country that was eligible in 2004, 2005, and/or 2006 for Compact or Threshold assistance. A country is determined to be a candidate for MCA funding if its per capita income falls within predetermined parameters set by Congress and is not subject to certain restrictions on U.S. foreign assistance. For 2007, a country with a per capita income level equal to or less than \$1,675 is included in this Scorebook as a low-income country (LIC). A country with a per capita income between \$1,676 and \$3,465 (inclusive) is considered to be a lower middle-income country (LMIC).

The distinction between LIC and LMIC countries is important to note because of a Congressional Provision that only 25 percent of MCA Compact assistance in any given year may be invested in Compacts for LMIC countries. This funding cap was included in the law establishing MCA because Congress sought to ensure that a majority of MCA assistance would be reserved for the world's poorest countries.

In selecting Compact and Threshold eligible countries, MCC's Board evaluates, to the maximum extent possible, candidate countries' performance on the policy indicators. To judge performance, it reviews whether countries score above the median on at least half of the indicators in each of three policy categories—*Ruling Justly*, Investing in People, and *Encouraging Economic*

*Freedom—and* above the median on the Corruption indicator. The Board may consider supplemental information and take into account factors such as data gaps or time lags to select the countries that will be eligible for MCA assistance. Data for the indicators are collected by independent, third party institutions and compiled by MCC.

Beginning with the selection of Compact-eligible countries for Fiscal Year 2007 (FY07), candidate countries were measured on two new performance measurements as supplemental information—*Natural Resources Management Index* and *Land Rights and Access Index*. The non-binding results were used to supplement data already compiled annually by MCC. These two new measurements will assess efforts by governments to provide clean drinking water, expand sanitation services, protect ecologically important areas, streamline the property registration process, and make land rights accessible and secure for poor and vulnerable populations, including women. It is anticipated these two new measurements will become integral as indicators in future country selections if adopted by the Board of Directors. MCC expects to recommend these measurements to the Board as indicators prior to the FY08 selection.

The *Natural Resources Management* and *Land Rights and Access* measurements have been in development for more than a year and included an extensive public comment period involving natural resources management experts, Congress, executive agencies, non-governmental organizations, think-tanks, and academics. The *Natural Resources Management Index* was created by Columbia University's Center for International Earth Science Information Network (CIESIN) and the Yale Center for Environmental Law and Policy (YCLEP). The *Land Rights and Access Index* combines the International Fund for Agricultural Development's (IFAD) Access to Land indicator with the International Finance Corporation's (IFC) Time and Cost of Property Registration indicators.

### **Indicators—What They Measure**

The 2007 Country Performance Scorebook measures the policy criteria mandated in the law establishing the MCA. By using information collected from independent third-party sources, MCC allows for an objective, com-



parable analysis across candidate countries. Data sources relied upon to produce this Scorebook are determined by the Board of Directors and are subject to change annually. Candidate countries regularly consult with the indicator institutions regarding their performance, to identify opportunities for reform and to raise questions about the data.

As a rule, MCC relies on data sources that meet the following criteria:

- Result from an independent third party;
- Utilize objective and high-quality data;
- Are analytically rigorous and publicly available;
- Have broad country-coverage and are comparable across countries;
- Possess clear theoretical or empirical links to economic growth and poverty reduction;
- Are policy-linked in that they measure factors that governments can influence within a two- to three-year horizon; and
- Have broad consistency in results from year to year.

The following indicators are measured by MCC in the three categories of *Ruling Justly*, *Investing in People*, and *Encouraging Economic Freedom*.

### **Ruling Justly**

Six indicators measure just and democratic governance, including a country's demonstrated commitment to promote political pluralism, equality and the rule of law; respect human and civil rights, including the rights of people with disabilities; protect private property rights; encourage transparency and accountability of government; and combat corruption.

- **Civil Liberties**—A panel of experts rates countries on freedom of expression, association and organizational rights, rule of law and human rights, and personal autonomy and economic rights. *Source: Freedom House*

- **Political Rights**—A panel of experts rates countries on the prevalence of free and fair elections; the ability of citizens to form political parties that may compete fairly in elections; freedom from domination by the military, foreign powers, totalitarian parties, religious hierarchies and economic oligarchies; and the political rights of minority groups. *Source: Freedom House*
- **Voice and Accountability**—An index of surveys rates countries on their institutions’ ability to protect civil liberties, the extent of citizen participation in government selection, and media independence. *Source: World Bank Institute*
- **Government Effectiveness**—An index of surveys rates countries on the quality of public service provision, civil service competency and independence from political pressures, and the government’s ability to plan and implement sound policies. *Source: World Bank Institute*
- **Rule of Law**—An index of surveys rates countries on the extent to which the public has confidence in and abides by rules of society; incidence of violent and non-violent crime; effectiveness and predictability of the judiciary; and the enforceability of contracts. *Source: World Bank Institute*
- **Control of Corruption**—An index of surveys rates countries on the frequency of “additional payments to get things done,” the effects of corruption on the business environment, “grand corruption” in the political arena, and the tendency of elites to engage in “state capture.” *Source: World Bank Institute*

### Investing in People

Four indicators measure investments in programs that promote broad-based primary education, strengthen and build capacity to provide quality public health, and reduce child mortality.

- **Public Expenditure on Health**—Total expenditures by the government at all levels on health divided by the Gross Domestic Product (GDP). *Source: World Health Organization*

- **Immunization**—The average of DPT<sub>3</sub> and measles immunization rates for the most recent year available. *Source: World Health Organization*
- **Public Expenditure on Primary Education**—Total expenditures by government at all levels on primary education divided by GDP. *Source: UNESCO and national sources*
- **Girls' Primary Completion Rate**—The number of female students completing primary education divided by the population in the relevant age cohort. *Source: UNESCO and the World Bank*

### Encouraging Economic Freedom

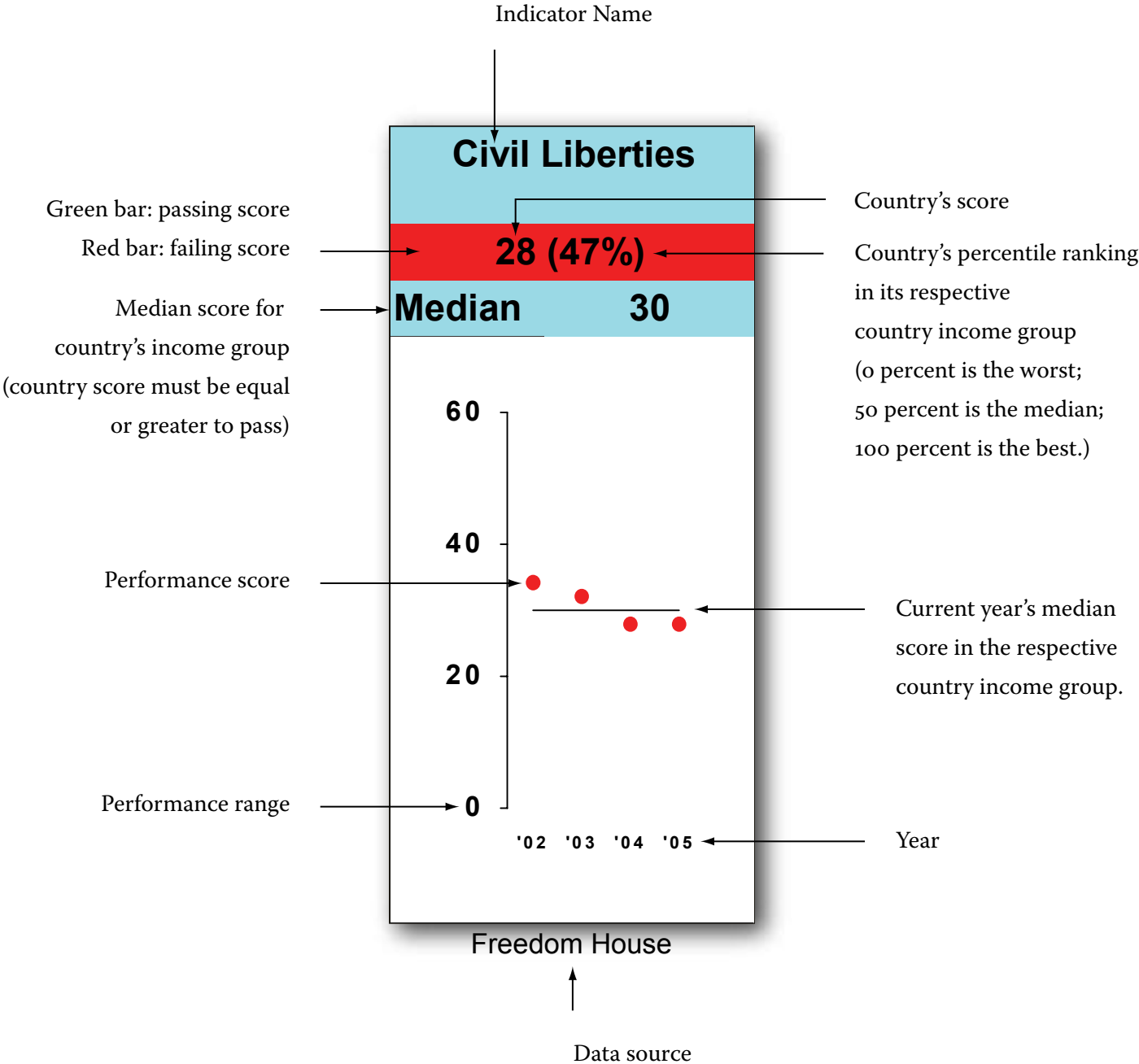
Six indicators measure the extent to which a government encourages economic freedom, including a demonstrated commitment to economic policies that encourage individuals and firms to participate in global trade and international capital markets, promote private sector growth and the sustainable management of natural resources, strengthen market forces in the economy, and respect worker rights, including the right to form labor unions.

- **Cost of Starting a Business**—The Private Sector Advisory Service of the World Bank Group works with local lawyers and other professionals to examine specific regulations that impact business investment. One of their studies measures the cost of starting a new business as a percentage of per capita income. *Source: World Bank Group/International Finance Corporation*
- **Inflation**—The most recent 12 month change in consumer prices as reported in the International Monetary Fund's (IMF) International Financial Statistics or in another public forum by the relevant national monetary authorities. *Source: IMF*
- **Fiscal Policy**—Overall budget deficit divided by GDP, averaged over a three-year period. The data is provided directly by the recipient government but is cross checked with other sources and made publicly available. *Source: National Governments and IMF*

- **Days to Start a Business**—The Private Sector Advisory Service of the World Bank Group works with local lawyers and other professionals to measure how many days it takes to open a new business. *Source: World Bank Group/International Finance Corporation*
- **Trade Policy**—A measure of a country's openness to international trade based on average tariff rates and non-tariff barriers to trade. *Source: Index of Economic Freedom, The Heritage Foundation*
- **Regulatory Quality Rating**—An index of surveys rates countries on the burden of regulations on business, price controls, the government's role in the economy, foreign investment regulation, and other related areas. *Source: World Bank Institute*

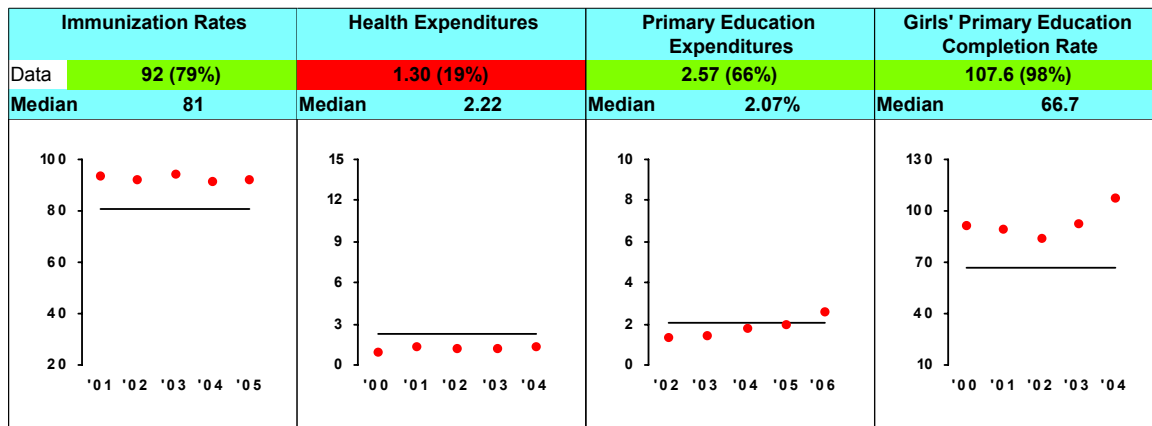

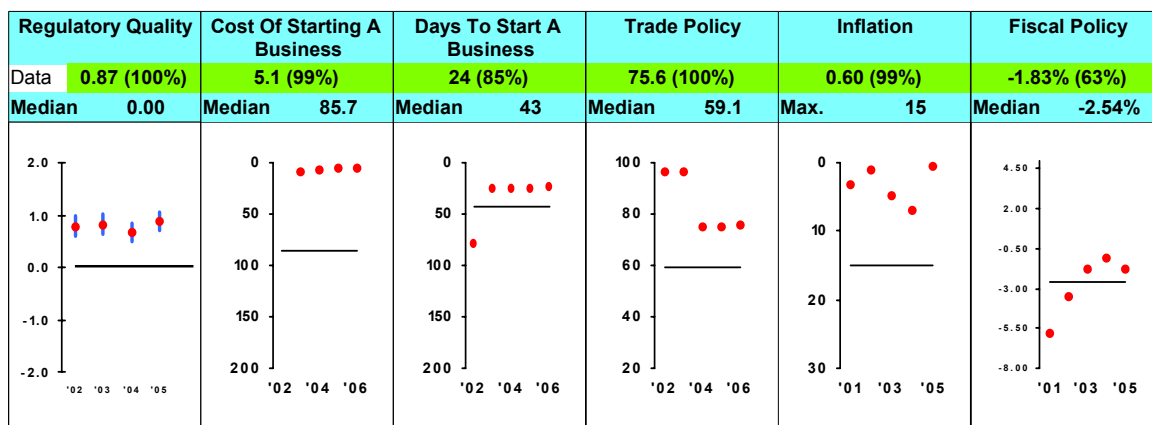
