

CONGRESSIONAL NOTIFICATION TRANSMITTAL SHEET

The planned increase is for the purpose of supporting the Government of Nepal in bridging an expected funding gap on the Transmission Line Activity, and to enable the achievement of Compact objectives.

REPORT AND JUSTIFICATION FOR THE PROPOSED INCREASE IN ASSISTANCE TO THE NEPAL COMPACT

Background

The Millennium Challenge Corporation's (MCC) \$500,000,000 Compact with the Government of Nepal (Compact) was signed on September 14, 2017, and entered into force on August 30, 2023. The Compact consists of (1) the Electricity Transmission Project, which aims to increase domestic electricity consumption by improving the availability and reliability of electricity in Nepal's electricity grid, expanding and strengthening Nepal's high voltage electricity transmission network to support new investments in generation that unlock Nepal's hydropower potential, and facilitating increased power trade between India and Nepal; and (2) the Road Maintenance Project, which aims to maintain quality across Nepal's primary road network.

Justification of Assistance

MCA-Nepal, the Government of Nepal entity overseeing compact implementation, launched a procurement for construction of the transmission lines under the Transmission Lines Activity on November 28, 2022. The Government of Nepal, MCA-Nepal, and MCC recognized the possibility of increased costs given the significant disruptions in global conditions in the intervening six years between the Compact's signing and its entry into force in August 2023. The parties put in place mitigation measures that included internal compact reallocations and an increase in the Government of Nepal contribution to bolster funding availability for the Transmission Lines Activity.

The financial offers that MCA-Nepal opened on September 5, 2023, significantly exceeded the available budget, requiring MCA-Nepal to reject all offers. Following this, MCA-Nepal identified design changes and potential cost-saving measures for the re-procurement, which was launched in November.

The additional MCC funding will be used to support the Government of Nepal in bridging a potential funding gap on the Transmission Line Activity and enable achievement of Compact objectives. The anticipated benefits of the additional funding are detailed below.

- Preserve full Compact Scope. The addition of the proposed funds will increase the financial capability of the Compact to fulfill the intended scope of the Electricity Transmission Project. Specifically, it will facilitate the ability of MCA-Nepal to sign contracts in a timely manner and maximize the remaining implementation period without further delays. The additional funds would also preserve adequate contingency across the Compact to facilitate cost adjustments that inevitably arise during construction.
- Strengthen Partnership and Relationship with the Government of Nepal. Additional MCC funding to help the Government of Nepal bridge an anticipated financial gap reinforces the collaborative nature of our partnership and strengthens the enabling environment for implementation. Such tangible demonstration of partnership is particularly merited in this context, where the Government of Nepal already increased its original \$130 million country contribution by a further \$67 million in May 2023, for a total of \$197 million—even though Nepal, as a low-income country, faced no country contribution requirement for this initial compact.

• Create Positive Example of USG Development Approach. The additional funds would help bolster MCC's reputation and positively demonstrate the United States' commitment to development with our partners in this geopolitically complex region. In this context, adding even limited grant funding, to secure the successful implementation of a high-return project would send a highly visible message that resonates beyond Nepal.
