






#### Kosovo Compact Signature July 15, 2022



## Energy Storage Project (1/4)

Supports Kosovo's energy security and transition to a cleaner energy future, as reflected by: (i) usage of energy storage systems for reserves, (ii) availability of the storage systems, and (iii) reduced cost of securing adequate electricity for Kosovo.

## Energy Storage Project (3/4) ~ Procurements Post EIF

#### Frequency Restoration Response Activity (FRR Activity) aims to support KOSTT

- Battery, transformers and control equipment;
- Land acquisition and improvements;
- Construction of additional electrical facilities and equipment including powerlines, substation improvements, and other interconnection related components;
- Training for existing and new-hire KOSTT employees; and
- Computer hardware and software.

#### Multi-functional Energy Storage Activity (MFES Activity) aims to support a new public entity

- Works required to increase Kosovo's electricity storage capability;
- Additional electrical facilities and equipment including batteries, power lines, transformers, and other interconnection related components;
- Land acquisition and improvements;
- MFES Entity staff; and
- Individual management advisory services and/or a management contract.






## Energy Storage Project (4/4) ~ Procurements Post EIF

#### Energy and Climate Policy Support Activity will provide...

- Policy and institutional reform to establish an ancillary services market in Kosovo;
- Regulatory support and technical assistance to GoK environmental agency;
- Technical assistance for pro-poor and inclusive planning;
- Measures to advance female employment and entrepreneurship across investments

## JETA Project (1/2)

The objectives are to (1) produce graduates who are hired in relevant jobs in the energy and adjacent sectors; and (2) increase employment of women among employers participating in the Inclusive Energy Sector Workforce Activity

**Energy Skills for the Future Activity** 

Establishment of new technical training programs or build from existing programs to provide the skills demanded by employers in the energy and adjacent sectors, with a focus on gender equity

#### Inclusive Energy Sector Workforce Activity

Promotion of gender equitable practices among energy sector employers, increase in female representation in energy companies in Kosovo, and support for networking, mentoring, and training opportunities for women



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# JETA Project – Questions and Answers





## American Catalyst Facility for Development Project (1/3)

The objective is to facilitate DFC blended finance transactions to catalyze private investments in Kosovo

#### **Options include:**

(i) augmenting MCC Funding to deliver a PPP alternative to a public entity for the MFES Activity;
(ii) leveraging private sector participation to facilitate additional private sector investment in leased energy storage systems and services;
(iii) catalyzing complementary renewable energy investments that bolster generation capacity and strengthen the energy storage entity business case, and
(iv) identifying climate finance investment opportunities.





## American Catalyst Facility for Development Project (2/3)

MCC and DFC developed the American Catalyst Facility for Development (ACFD) to increase collaboration and enhance America's Development toolkit.

The ACFD is a blended finance mechanism which provides strategic grants to catalyze private sector investment in MCC countries.

The ACFD establishes a dedicated pool of grant funding for projects within MCC programs to *de-risk private sector investments in key sectors*.

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#### **Procurement Principles**

- Open, fair, and competitive procedures
- Qualified and capable bidders
- Winning contracts are price-reasonable and best value

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MCC mandatory thresholds require reviews and/or approvals during procurement process:

Bidding documents, evaluation reports and, in some cases, contracts (See Approvals Matrix in MCC PPG).



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## MCC Core Principles and Competitive Selection

#### MCC Mission is to: Reduce poverty through economic growth

How MCC selects countries?	<ul> <li>MCC's Board of Directors uses a data-driven, transparent method to identify the best-governed poor countries where MCC can reduce poverty through economic growth</li> <li>MCC measures countries' policy performance based on 20 independent indicators</li> <li>Only low-income and lower-middle income countries are considered for MCC funding</li> </ul>
MCC Investments	<ul> <li>Promote economic growth</li> <li>Help people lift themselves out of poverty</li> <li>Create more stable, secure countries and regions</li> <li>Open the door for companies to work in new markets with fewer up-front risks</li> <li>Enhance American interests</li> </ul>
Core Principles	<ul> <li>Competitive countries selection</li> <li>Country-led solutions</li> <li>Country-led implementation</li> </ul>



## What Makes MCC Unique

- County selection based on country commitment to good governance
- Minimum economic rate of return
- Compacts' strict 5-year clock
- Focus on results and Country-led solutions and implementation. Funding is committed to specific programs' deliverables
- Invoices are paid directly by the U.S. Treasury to the contractor
- When Compacts are Entered into Force (EIF) the funds are available from US Treasury, and are "locked in" and not dependent on the Appropriation Bill passing
- The procurement process establishes a fair competition
- Winning contracts are price-reasonable and best value
- International environmental and labor standards are enforced
